Welcome to the 2026 Team Shelby Carlisle Weekend. We would like to thank you for joining us this weekend as we celebrate the 60th anniversary of the GT40's sweeping the top three places at Le Mans in 1966, and the 35th anniversary of the Carroll Shelby Foundation! Be safe and have a great time!

Our Carlisle Weekend will officially begin on Friday ("unofficially" on Thursday) and run through late Sunday morning. There will be more time for visiting, walking the show field, and enjoying all the activities that the Ford Nationals at Carlisle has to offer.

Based on your feedback to our "Give the People What They Want" event survey, we have made a few changes this year. Instead of a Friday morning activity, we will move that event to Thursday afternoon, prior to our 'unofficial' kick-off party on Thursday evening. That will allow us a more leisurely Friday at the Carlisle Fairgrounds. Also, we have moved the Team Shelby Grand Entrance to Friday morning right after breakfast, so once you drive into the Fairgrounds and park, you won't need to move your car for the remainder of the day and risk losing your parking space. We heard you, and hope this (and other changes) make your Carlisle Weekend even more damn fun!

ENTRANCE INTO THE ALL FORD NATIONALS

Carlisle All Ford Nationals Window Sticker – Hopefully by now, you have already pre-registered with Carlisle Events and secured your Gate-N-Go Show field entry window sticker and affixed it to your windshield. If you don't have your window sticker, you will have to get your window sticker at Gate 3.

Parking: You must park in your class-designated parking area at all times, regardless of car club affiliations or events, unless special permission is granted by Carlisle.

THURSDAY, JUNE 4th GETTYSBURG BATTLEFIELD DRIVING TOUR *AFTERNOON EVENT*



Thursday afternoon, (maybe not quite as late as the photo above depicts) we will gather at the Gettysburg Battlefield, which is closer to Carlisle than you might expect, and enjoy a driving tour led by our Baltimore Area Chapter Director. The tour will take us past some of the larger monuments, with stops to explore and take photos.

The Gettysburg cruise will depart from McPherson's Ridge Monument at 2:00 pm, then regroup at the Military Park Museum, prior to heading into the Battlefield. The tour will cover 16 points of interest, with multiple stops for photos. The Battle of Gettysburg was fought July 1–3, 1863, in and around the town of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, by Union and Confederate forces during the American Civil War. The tour will take about 3 hours to complete.

After the tour there is an optional stop at the Battlefield Brew Works & Spirits in Gettysburg for a Team Shelby exclusive dinner buffet. The cost of dinner (\$30.00) is not included in your Team Shelby package, but you did need to RSVP to ensure your seat.

The Battlefield Brew Works is located in a historic Civil War building in Adams County. The distillery and restaurant deliver a unique experience for the whole family. Whether you come for the finest craft beers, artisanal distilled spirits, or some of the best food in the area, checking out Battlefield Brew Works & Spirits of Gettysburg Distillery will enhance your visit. Proudly boasting national and international award-winning artisanal spirits. Spirits of Gettysburg Distillery has won 14 medals in national and international competitions.

The distillery and restaurant/pub building is special. A Pennsylvania Dutch brick end barn, four courses of brick deep with decorative hole patterns in the brickwork is architecturally significant. Built around 1848, the barn was part of one of the largest Confederate field hospitals after the battle. It stands as an excellent example of adaptive re-use.

If you missed the deadline to pre-register for the All Ford Nationals, you will have to get your window sticker at Gate 3 when you arrive. You will not be allowed to enter the Show field without a window sticker.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: *This year, all auto classes will be assigned a different Class Number when the Show field is laid out. The window stickers' numbers may change from the original registration numbers. The new number will be on your windshield sticker and all signs at the event. You must park in your class-designated parking area at all times, regardless of car club affiliations or events, unless special permission is granted.*

Experience all that is Carlisle Ford Nationals, and there is a lot to experience! This is the largest and most thrilling all-Ford event in the world. Ford, Mercury and Lincoln fans will have a showcase of nearly 3000 vehicles to check out on the Show field.

During this event, you will enjoy great indoor displays of concepts, customs and historically significant cars and trucks, a burnout competition, activities for the kids, industry guests, giveaways, autocross for all skill levels and club gatherings. The excitement continues with a shopping experience you won't soon forget as part of the enormous swap meet, car corral and the Manufacturers Midway for the best in parts buying.

When you are weary from walking around the Carlisle Fairgrounds, head back to the Team Shelby tent for some rest and meeting up with other Shelby friends. **Please note that no food and drinks will be provided on Friday, June 5th, but you can certainly use our tables and chairs to eat and relax!**

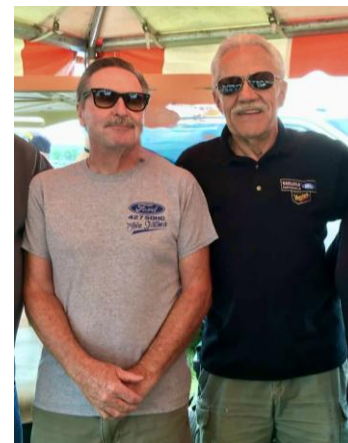
Former Ford Drag Team Member Comes to Carlisle

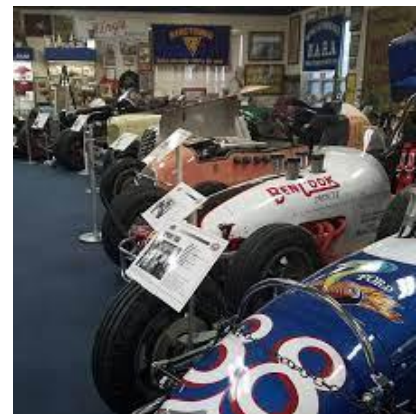
PLAN "B": EASTERN MUSEUM OF MOTOR RACING (IF INCLEMENT WEATHER)

Our "Cars Under the Stars" car show voting begins right as people start arriving at 5:30 pm. The car show will use the "People's Choice" format where Your Vote Counts! APPENDIX 1 GETTYSBURG DRIVING TOUR

This cruise will start at the Military Park Museum and cover 16 stops on the driving tour with multiple stops for photos. The Battle of Gettysburg was fought July 1–3, 1863, in and around the town of Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, by Union and Confederate forces during the American Civil War.

Duration: 2.5 hours (1 hour Driving time plus time added to stops)

Note: During this cruise, we will be on a tight schedule to ensure we have ample time to get to Battlefield Brew Works (248 Hunterstown Rd, Gettysburg) no later than 5:30 pm.

Meetup: Thursday, June 4th, 2026, at 2:00pm at Auto Tour Stop #1 McPherson's Ridge Monument:

Getting to McPherson's Ridge:

From the Carlisle Fairgrounds, McPherson's Ridge is a 30-mile ride down Pennsylvania Rt 34. Driving the posted limits, it should take about an hour.

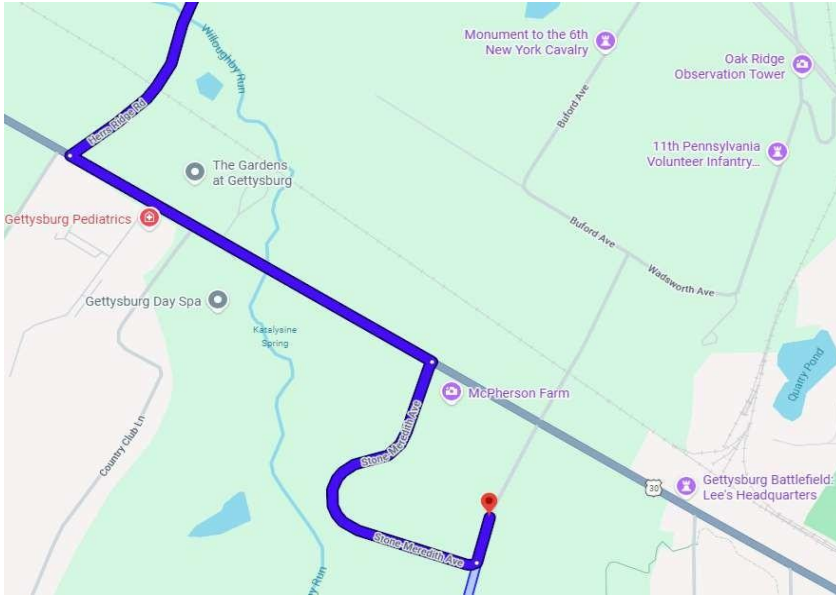
As you approach the town of Gettysburg, you will bear right on Herra Ridge Rd. Follow Herra Ridge Rd to the Lincon Hwy (Rt 30) and make a left. You will then make a right onto Stone-Meredith Ave. Follow Stone-Meredith Ave around to Reynolds Ave and make a left. Park near the 1st Brigade 1st Div Cavalry Corps Monument. Or near any of the Shelbys already there. See “Stop #1 Detail Map”

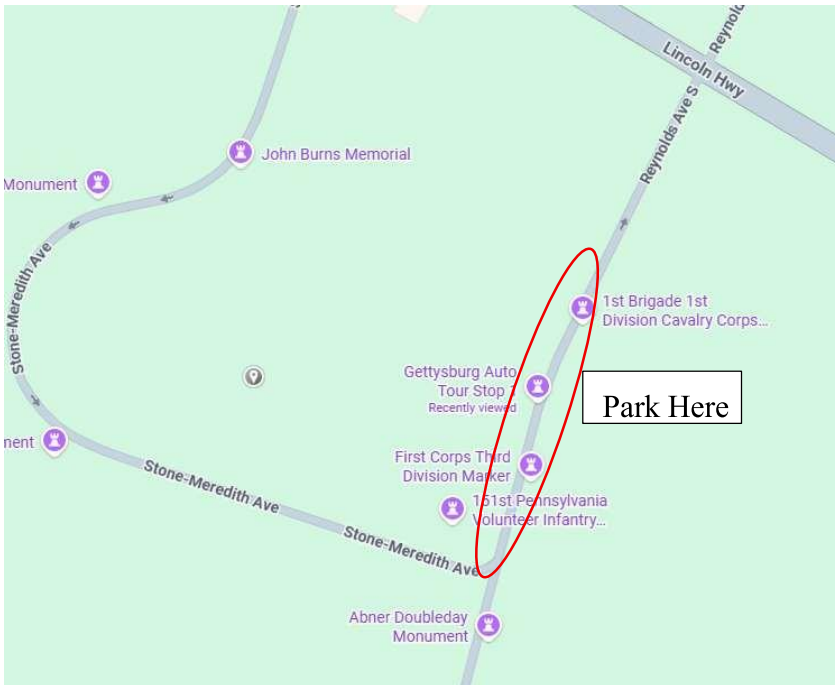

Stop #1: McPherson's Ridge

At McPherson's Ridge, Union and Confederate armies clash and generals on both sides order their regiments into place. We'll be able to imagine the movements of the battle as we look out over the ridge.

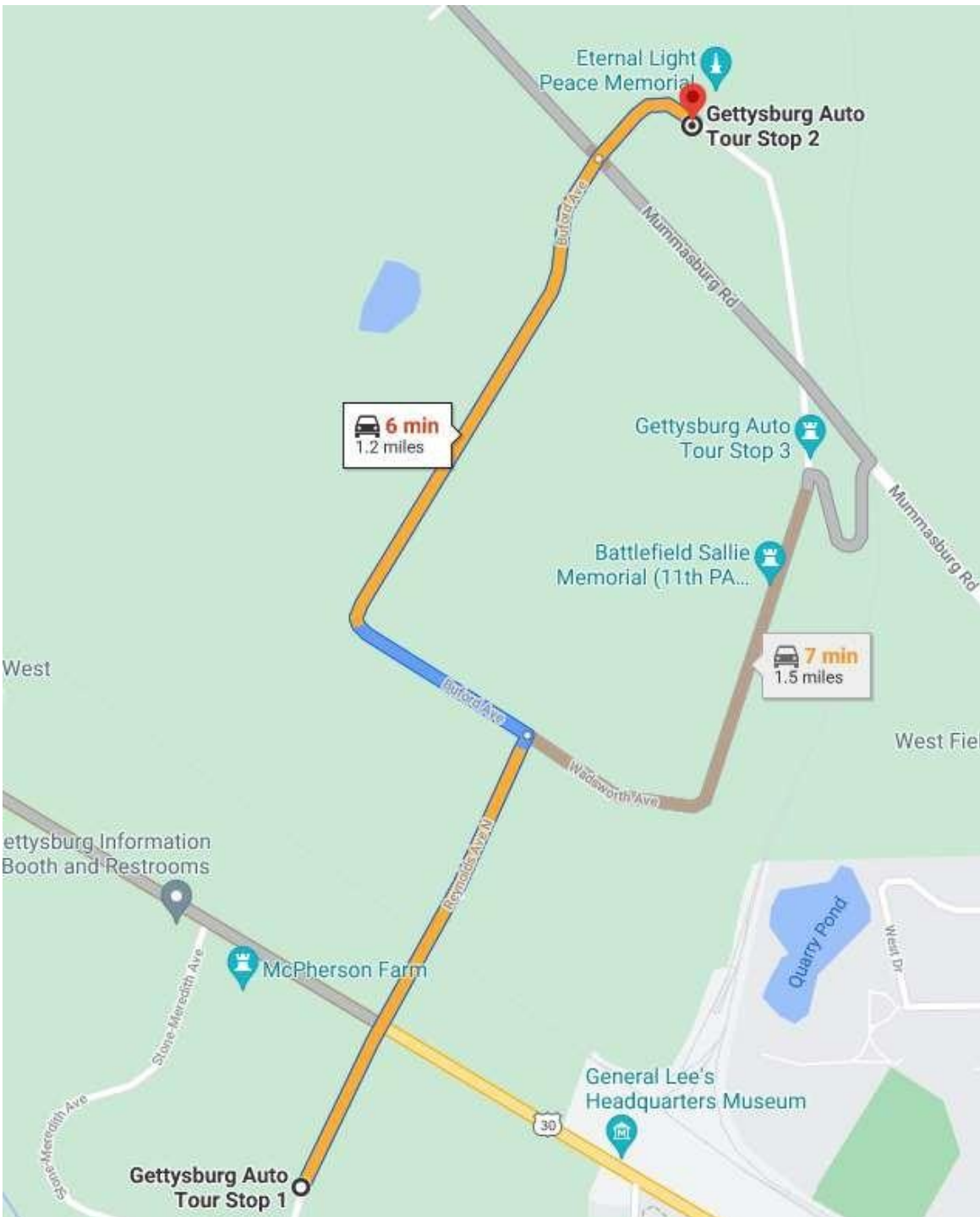


Stop #1 Detail Map



Stop #2: Eternal Light Peace Memorial

The Eternal Light Peace Memorial. This memorial commemorates the reunification of the United States. Maine granite forms the base, while Alabama limestone forms the pillar -- a symbolic unification of north and south.



- Reynolds Ave to Buford: Right Turn
- Follow Buford to the tower

Traffic & time permitting, we will stop at the peace memorial for a group photo. If it's too crowded, we will pull over on Confederate Ave by the fences.



Stop #3: Oak Ridge Observation Tower

The top of this tower is a great place to get panoramic views of the historic fields that once saw so much violence and bloodshed.

- Follow Confederate Ave to the Tower

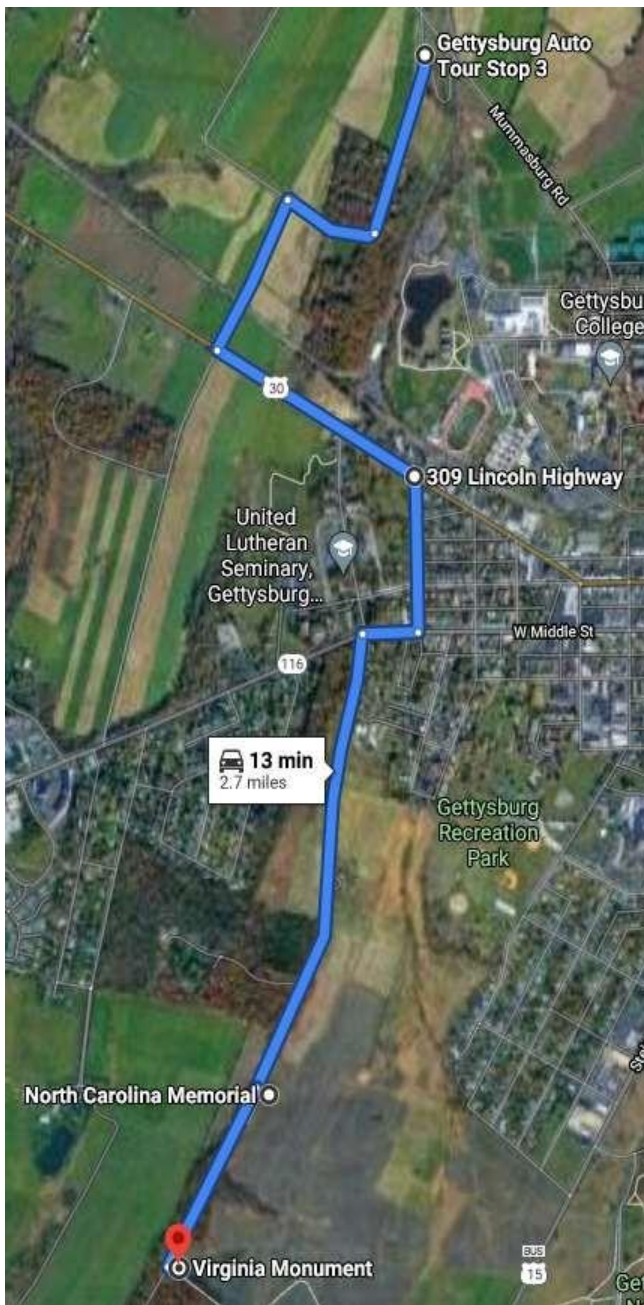

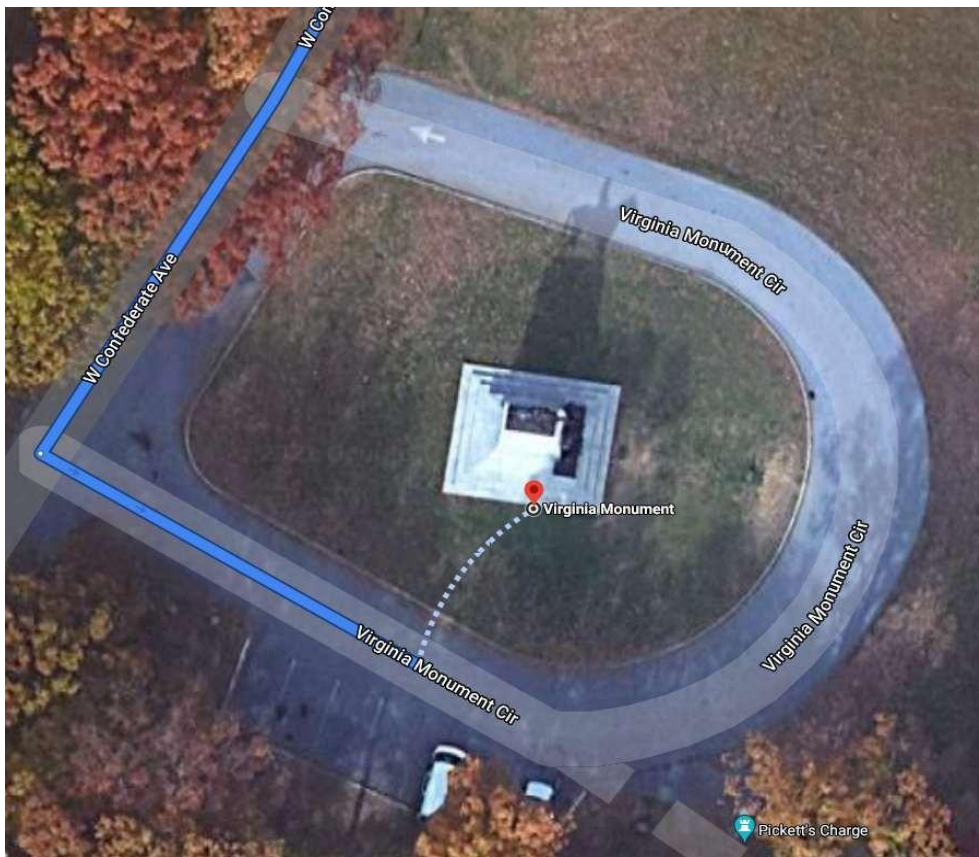
Stops #4 & #5: Our drive takes us past the North Carolina Memorial and Virginia Monument.

Our drive takes us past the North Carolina Memorial and Virginia Monument. We will plan to pull into the Virginia Memorial. This is one of the best photo ops on the cruise. The infamous Pickett's Charge on Day 3 began at this stop



- Head south on Doubleday Ave which turns into Wadsworth Ave as it curves right.
- At Reynolds Ave make a left and head south.
- At Lincoln Hwy (Rt 30) make a left and head east to Seminary Ridge St: Right Turn.
- South on Seminary Ridge. Cross Rt 116 and it turns into SW Confederate Ave. Take that south past the North Carolina Monument and pull into the VA Monument.

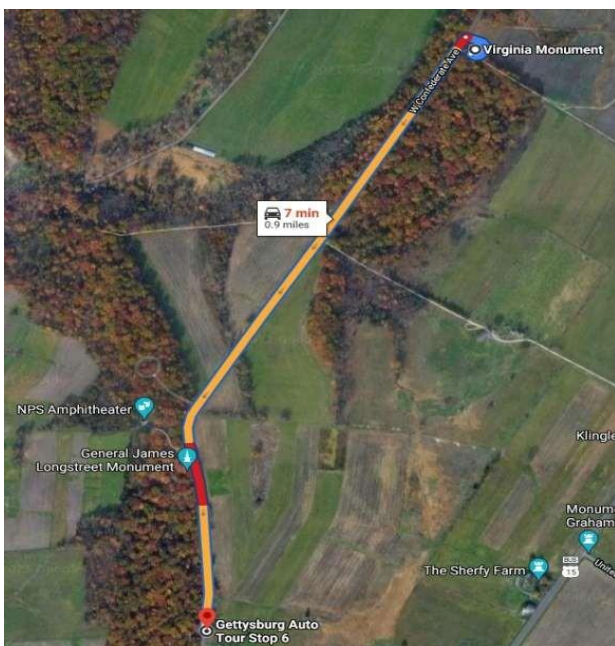
Detail view of the Virginia memorial



Stop #6: Pitzer Woods

Pitzer Woods at Gettysburg is on the southern end of Seminary Ridge. At the time of the battle these woods were owned by Samuel Pitzer. His house still stands in the Eisenhower National Historic Site. The 1st United States Sharpshooters scouted the woods towards midday on July 2nd. They engaged Alabama troops that were gathering for Longstreet's attack. Later in the afternoon Confederate General Barksdale's Mississippi Brigade waited in reserve here before its attack toward the Sherfy House.

Stop #7: Warfield Ridge

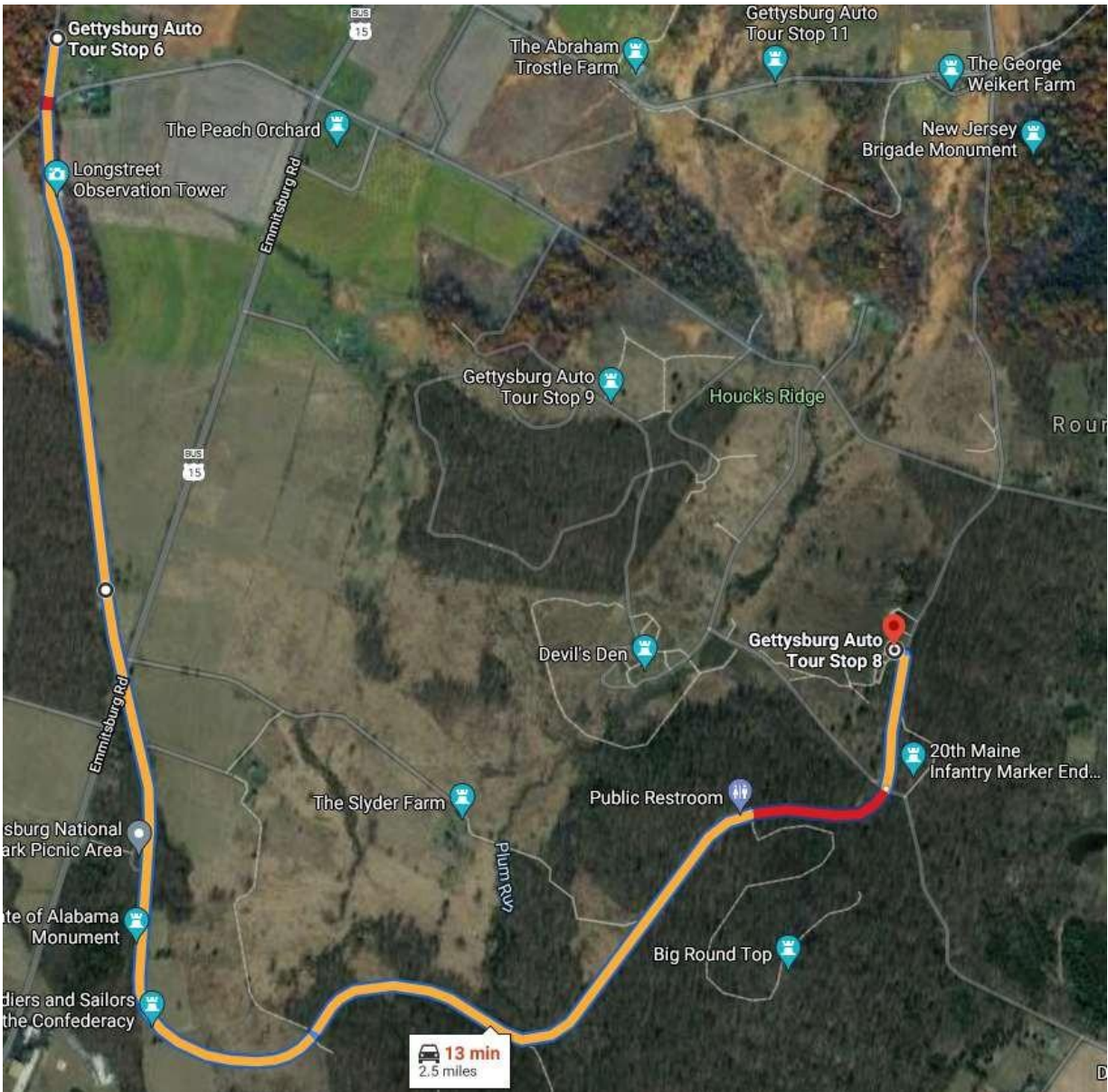
Day 2 of the battle. Confederate troops assemble here, ready to attack one of the strategic Union outposts. Specially trained Union marksmen are in position to defend. The stage is set...

- We will drive along Confederate Ave past the Longstreet Observation Tower and Warfield Ridge onto Little Round Top

Stop #8: Little Round Top

Little Round Top, a critical skirmish site on the second day. Here Union soldiers just barely hold off Confederate troops, maintaining their control of this strategic hill. As we drive around the hill, we'll cross the Valley of Death -- an appropriate name for the site of such a bloody skirmish.

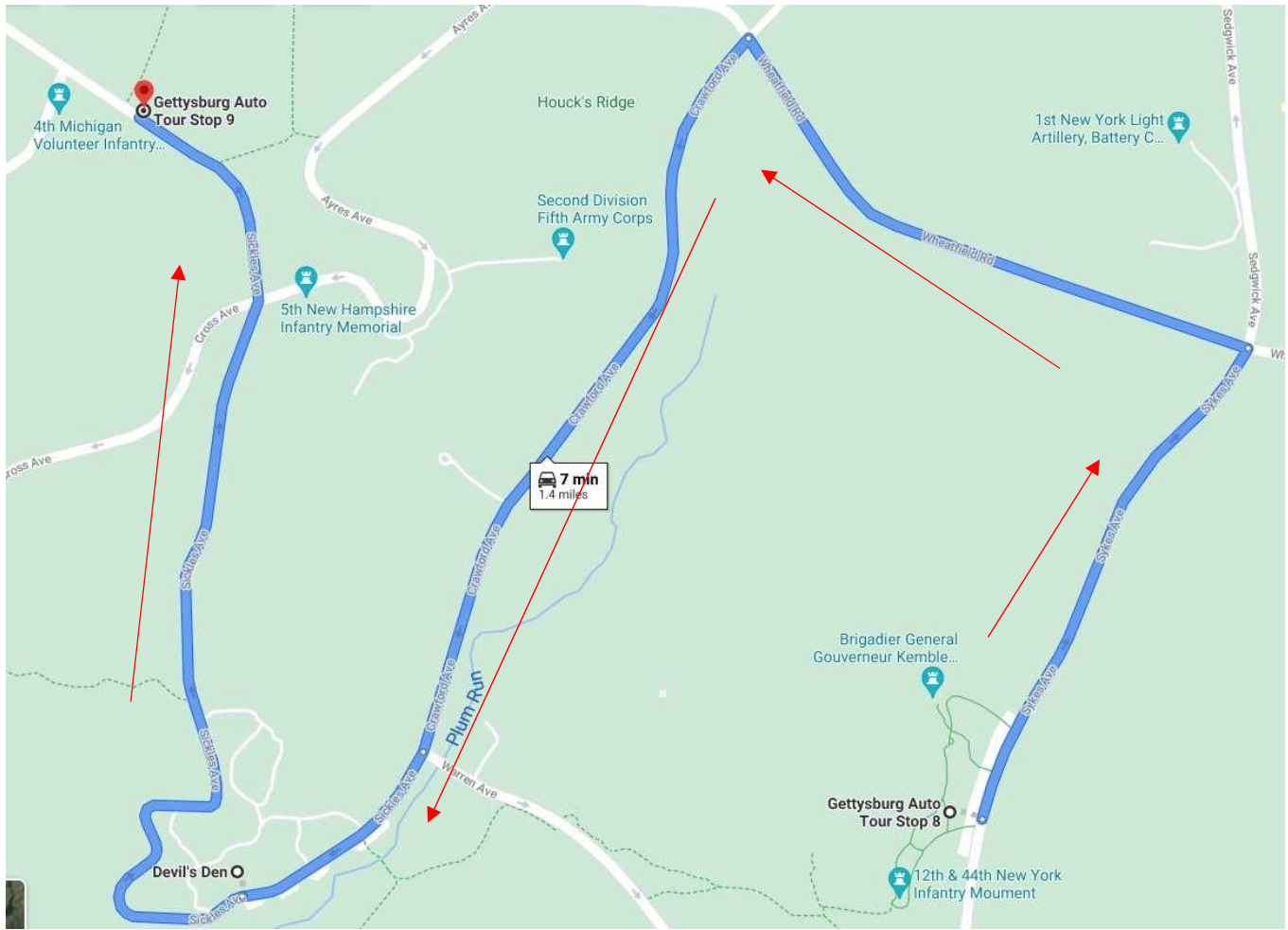

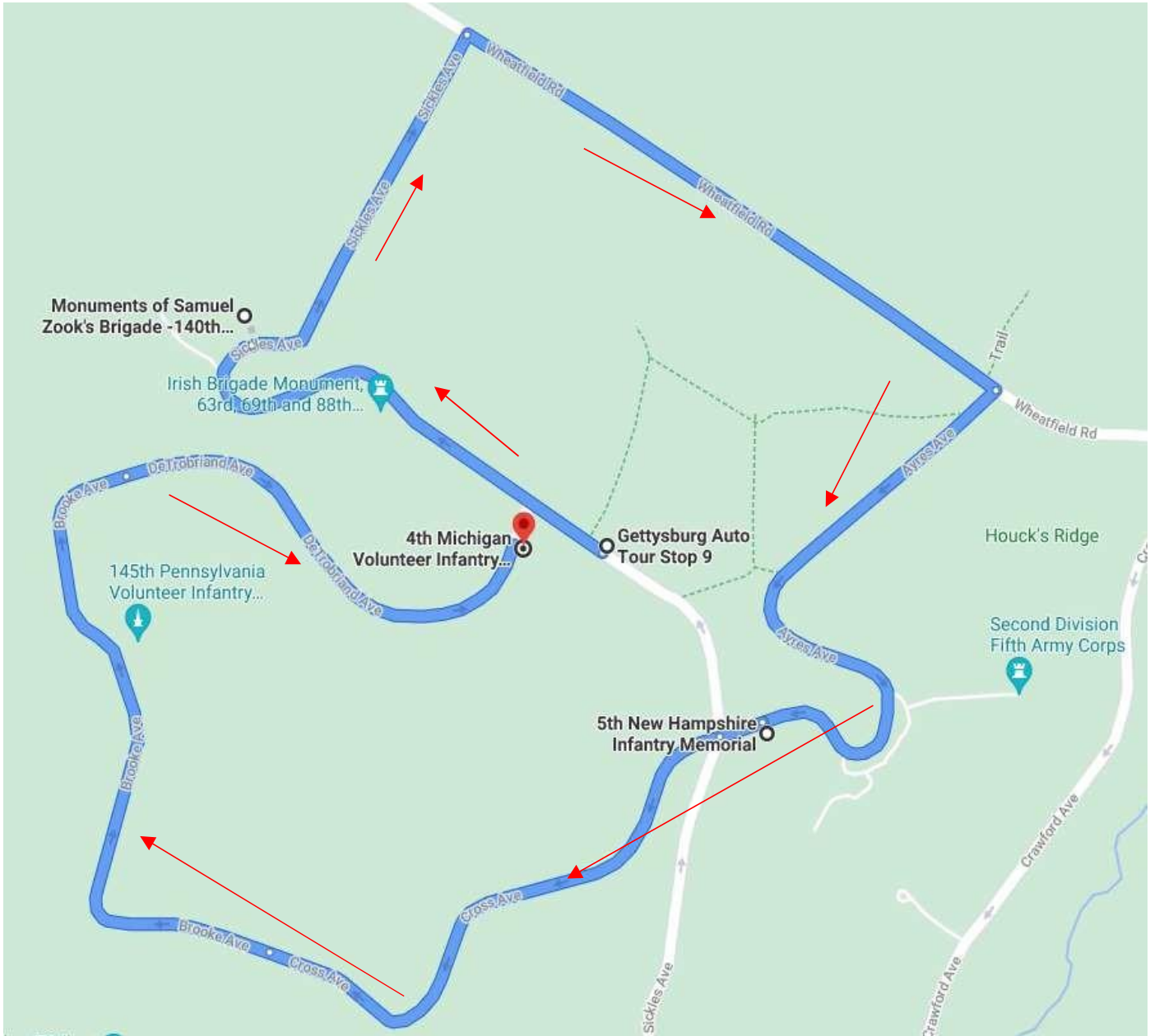
Stop #9: Devil's Den and the Wheatfield

Here, Confederate sharp's shooters set up positions among the volcanic rocks. From the safety of the rocky cover at Devil's Den, they're able to pick off soldier after soldier on the Union side.

- Out of Little Round Top, North on Sykes, left on Wheatfield, left on Crawford, south to Sickles and up the hill by the Devils Den. Many Monuments here.

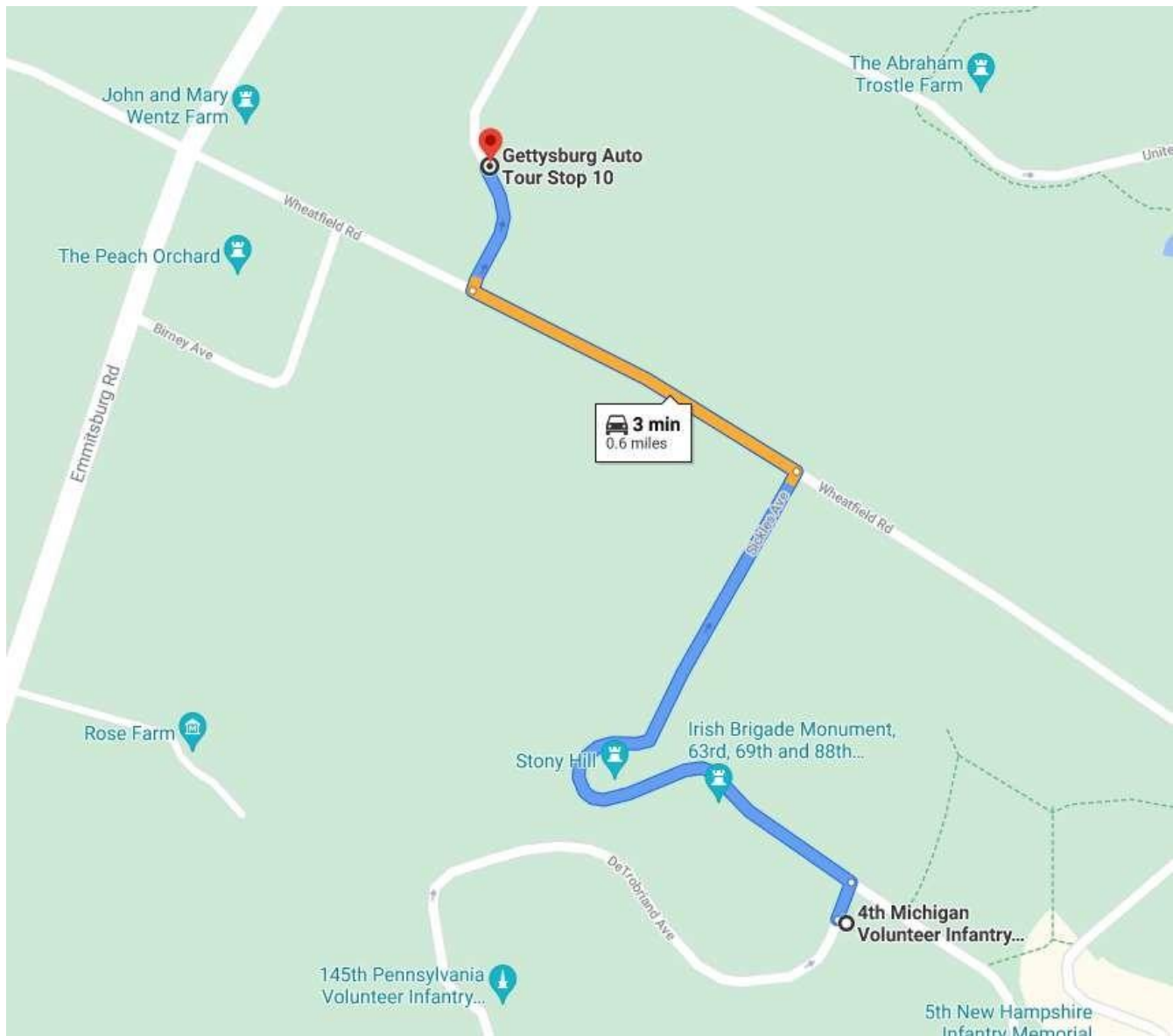


- We will continue and loop around on the “one ways” through this area



Stop #10: The Peach Orchard

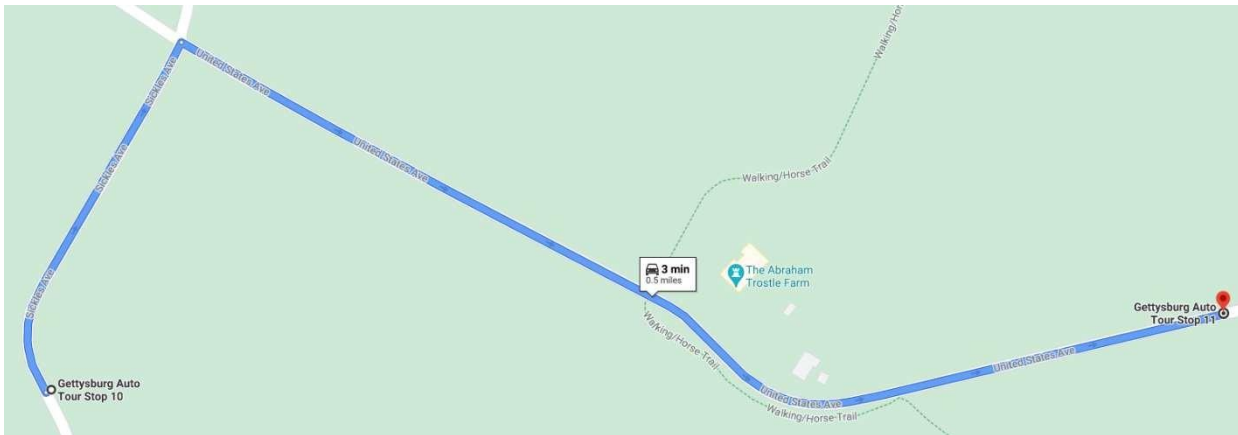
The Peach Orchard, where the battles of the second day continued. General Sickles's questionable advance forced Longstreet's artillery and infantry to fight for every inch of ground to Cemetery Ridge. The Confederate attack crushed the Peach Orchard salient and other parts of the Union line, threatening the left flank of Maj. Gen. George Meade's army.



Stop #11: Plum Run

Plum Run rises on the Codori farm and drains the area between Cemetery Ridge and Seminary Ridge south of Gettysburg, flowing south past the Trostle and J. Weikert farms, through the Valley of Death between Little Round Top and Devils Den, past the Slyder farmhouse and finally leaving the battlefield between Big Round Top and Warfield Ridge. It eventually becomes part of the Monocacy River and the Potomac. Its location at the heart of the heaviest fighting on July 2nd and 3rd makes it one of the most fought-across streams in America, but nowhere on the battlefield does it serve as even a modest barrier to movement.

- North on Sickles to United States Ave: Right Turn to Plum Run

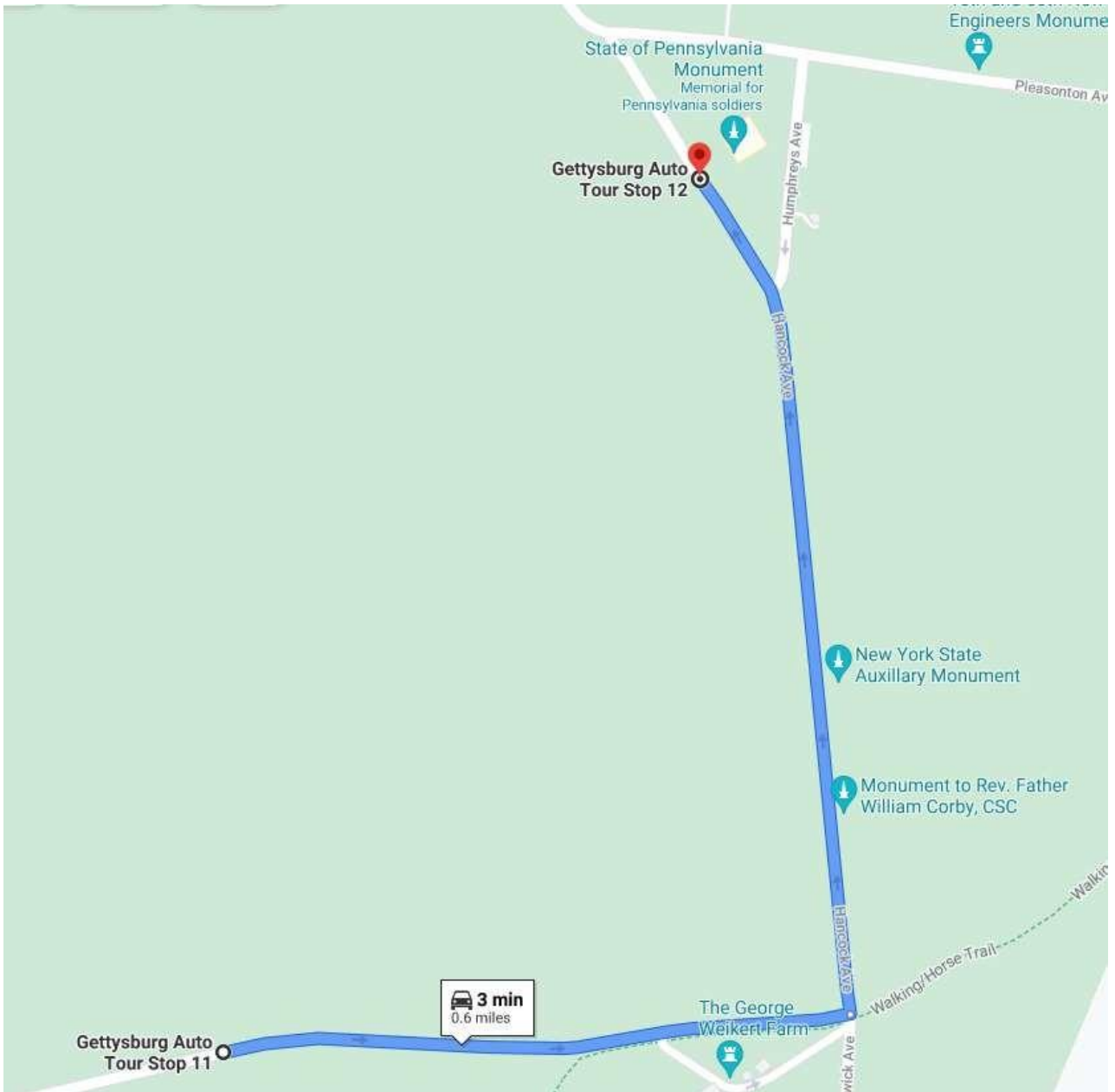
As we head to the Pennsylvania Memorial, we will stop at the New York Memorial which is a great group photo stop



Stop #12: Pennsylvania Memorial

This monument commemorates the nearly 35,000 Pennsylvanian soldiers who fought in this battle. While the stakes were high for everyone, they were particularly intense for these men of Pennsylvania: they weren't fighting for an abstract idea, they were fighting for their very state.

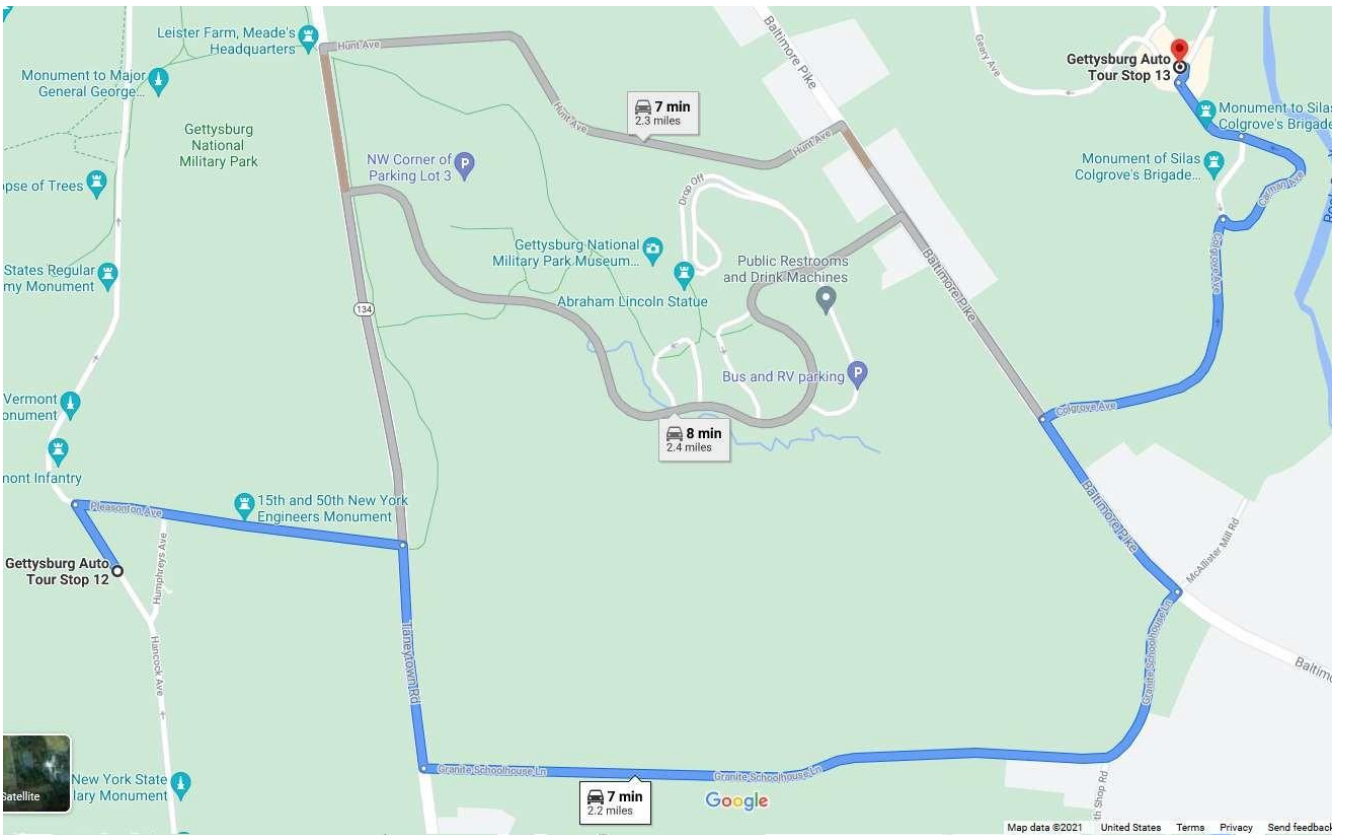
- East on United States, Left Turn on Hancock



Stop #13: Spangler's Spring

Spangler's Spring at Gettysburg is a natural spring on the south base of Culp's Hill. (Spangler's Spring Area tour map) It was occupied by each side during the battle, and for a time was in between the lines. Legends developed that local truces were called during the night of July 2nd where both sides allowed the other to pass safely to the spring to fill their canteens. But there are also documented instances of fighting around the spring during this time.

- North on Hancock to Pleasonton Ave: Right turn
- East on Pleasonton Ave to Taneytown Rd: Right turn
- South on Taneytown Rd to Granite Schoolhouse Lane: Left turn
- East on Granite Schoolhouse Lane to Baltimore Pike: Left turn
- North on Baltimore Pike to Colgrove Ave: Right turn
- Follow Colgrove up to Spangler's Spring

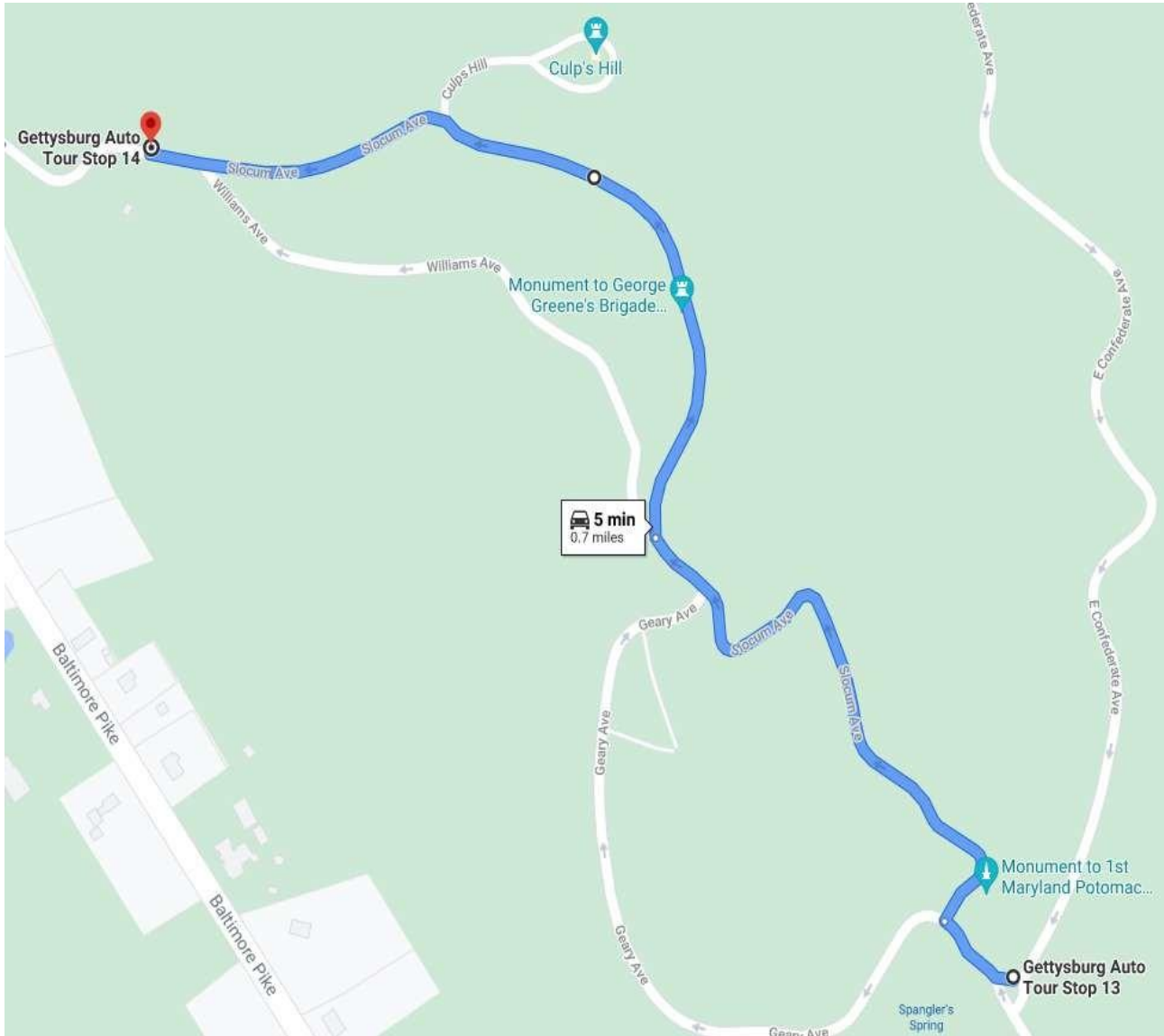


Stop #14: East Cemetery Hill

Originally known as Raffensperger's Hill, East Cemetery Hill hosted a bloody encounter that by all accounts could have compromised the entire Union position at Gettysburg.

- Head north up Slocum Ave past the George Green monument and Culp's Hill.



Stop #15: High Water Mark

The third day dawns, and the Union and Confederate troops prepare for a final, epic battle. This is the infamous Pickett's Charge by the Confederates. We'll stand at the top of the hill, looking down at the empty expanse of the final battlefield. As we follow the progress of this last charge, we'll take a look at the "high water mark" -- the spot that marks the farthest the Confederacy advanced up the hill, towards the Union defenses.

- Continue on Slocum Ave to Baltimore Pike: Left turn
- South on Baltimore Pike to Hunt Ave: Right turn
- West on Hunt Ave to Taneytown Rd: Left turn
- South to Pleasonton Ave: Right turn
- Pleasonton West and bear right onto Hancock Ave

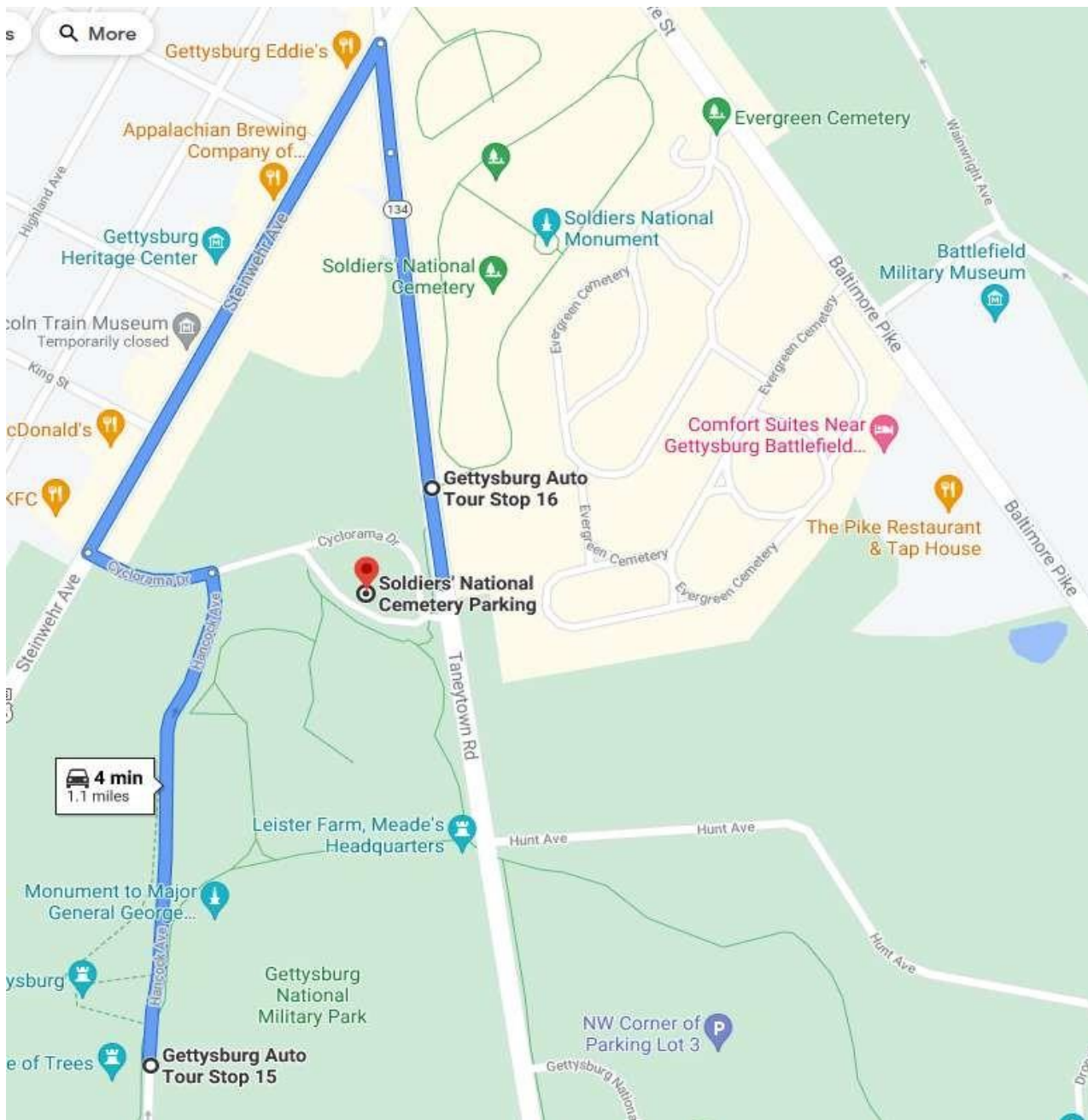


Stop #16: The National Cemetery and Lincoln's Gettysburg Address Memorial

National Cemetery. Here we visit and honor the graves of the fallen Union soldiers who defended their country and morals.

This is also the site of President Abraham Lincoln's famed Gettysburg Address. Given the monumental nature of the battle, most people expected President Lincoln to deliver quite a lengthy speech. But Lincoln didn't want to steal attention that he believed belonged to the Union soldiers who sacrificed their lives here. Our tour officially ends at this final, poignant stop.

- North on Hancock Ave to Cyclorama Dr: Left turn
- Cyclorama west to Steinwehr Ave: Right turn
- North on Steinwehr Ave to Taneytown Rd: Sharp Right
- South on Taneytown to the Soldiers National Cemetery Parking: Right turn □ From there we walk to the Cemetery and Gettysburg Address Memorial
